Animal Health

Do not visit if you have chickens or other fowl or have handled birds within the last two weeks. (Keepers of poultry are welcome to contact us by e-mail or phone first in order to make arrangements to meet and share ideas.)

If you have visited other farms, make sure your cloths and boots are washed and clean.

We are not a petting zoo. Do not feed or handle the animals unless accompanied by a farm family member or employee.

Visitor Safety

Use good common sense. We are a working farm.

Stay in the areas designated for visitors. Do not enter pasture areas without permission. (We do have bulls on the farm.)

Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Do not climb on equipment or other farm property.

Do not enter any buildings without permission.
